Description: This retrospective notification advises that the Sunscreen (Product Safety Standard) Bill 2021 was finalized in March 2022, giving effect to proposals as notified in G/TBT/N/NZL/108. This document signaled our intention to set a mandatory product safety standard for all sunscreen products in trade in New Zealand, to be enforced under section 29 of the Fair Trading Act 1986. The Bill entered into force in September 2022.

Minor changes were made to the proposals of the consultation document, as follows:

1. The standard referenced in the Act now refers to AS/NZS 2604:2012 instead of AS/NZS 2604:2021 to better align with international standards.

2. S(b)(ii) now says 'a product that is represented as skin care', to reflect the language used to define skincare in the AS/NZS 2604:2021. This change was made to reduce confusion and minimize costs as both standards would otherwise need to be purchased for compliance purposes.
