Description of content: The Proposal to amend the Cosmetic Products Group Standard 2020 (the Group Standard) includes proposals to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">· Update lists of cosmetic ingredients subject to certain rules (including those that are banned/restricted) to be consistent with current annexes of EU Cosmetics Products Regulation (Regulation (EC) No 1223/2009);· Expand the scope of the Group Standard to require products that are not hazardous in themselves but do contain a hazardous component to comply with the Group Standard;· Introduce a phase-out of PFAS (perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances) containing cosmetic products by 31 December 2025;

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Updating requirements to adhere to the International Fragrance Association (IFRA) Standards to reference the 50th amendment of those standards, and any subsequent versions; · Providing for appropriate transitional arrangements; and <p>Several other minor drafting changes.</p>

Objective and rationale, including the nature of urgent problems where applicable: The proposed changes to the Cosmetic Products Group Standard 2020 (the Group Standard) are intended to align with developments in the European Union (EU), with the objective of ensuring the protection of human health or safety and protection of the environment.</p>
